Global Village enables students to contribute to our mission of bringing communities together to help families build strength, stability, and self-reliance through shelter. Each team fundraises to support Habitat for Humanity Australia's programs and spends a week building a house alongside the local community in the Asia Pacific region.

A Global Village build is a unique opportunity to develop leadership and teamwork skills, build intercultural competence, and engage in genuine service learning.

You will spend a week immersed in cultures very different from your own. Working in partnership with the local communities overseas, you can witness firsthand and understand the challenges of living without safe and secure housing, and play an active role in contributing to a solution.

what will i do on a build?

Your team may work on one or several houses, or you may even build a toilet or well. The work will use local construction techniques and materials. You could be mixing concrete, weaving bamboo, digging foundations, laying bricks, hammering, rendering or painting. You will be supported by skilled workers and encouraged to try new tasks, take breaks and work to your strengths.

COST TYPE	AMOUNT	WHAT'S INCLUDED
Registration fee	\$200	This amount covers medical and evacuation insurance, your online fundraising page and a build pack to get you on your way.
Minimum program donation	\$1,000	This contribution is tax deductible and we encourage you to fundraise this amount. This donation is be split between Habitat Australia and the Habitat host country to fund life changing projects, like your build.
In-country expenses Varies for each country, team size and itinerary	\$800 – \$1300	These expenses can be fundraised but are not tax deductible. This amount will go towards the budget the school and the Habitat host country will devise to cover your accommodation, meals, bottled water, ground transportation and local activities.

Flights, visa, vaccinations, travel insurance and personal expenses are not included in your Global Village build costs.

Not all Global Village build costs are refundable, please see the Habitat Cancellation Policy on the last page.

- Regular updates, reminders, and support to make sure you are on track.


All donations over \$2 are tax deductible. Sponsors who contribute to your tax-deductible donation will receive a thank you email and tax receipt from Habitat Australia.

safety

what about safety?

Habitat has a long history of working in other countries, and volunteer health and safety is our top priority.

Habitat Country Program Staff know and live in the area and help ensure a safe and valuable experience for volunteers year after year. We also follow international travel advisories closely. We do everything possible to keep volunteers safe, both on and off the work site, and your registration fee includes insurance which covers medical treatment, medical evacuation, security/political evacuation and natural disaster evacuation. However, it is up to each individual to follow the instructions of team leaders and country program coordinators for the best experience possible. Safety briefings are given both in Australia (before you leave) and in country.

health and safety provisions on site

Each build site has:

- A comprehensive first-aid kit
- Emergency vehicle on standby
- Personal safety equipment
- Safety signage and regular safety reminders
- Designated and trained construction supervisor and volunteer coordinator
- An emergency management plan
- Plentiful supply of water, fruit and/or other snacks

Cancellation



Cancellation policy

Habitat for Humanity Australia (HFHA) will make every effort to conduct the trip as scheduled. In the event that this is not possible (due to safety concerns, security issues, COVID-19, or other reasons), HFHA will endeavour to re-route or defer the team.

If the trip must be cancelled or you can no longer take part, HFHA will work with you to find another suitable build

HFHA cannot compensate participants for the cost of unusable airfare or any other expenses resulting from the cancellation. It is strongly recommended that school groups purchase travel insurance that covers change of travel and/or country closure.

All donations received by HFHA on behalf of the volunteer or team are committed to the field and are non-refundable. The registration fee is refundable if for any reason HFHA cancels the build before the scheduled start date. If for any reason your team can no longer make the build the registration fee is not refundable. However, if the cancellation is more than 60 days before the build start date, the registration fee is transferable within a 24 month period to join another Global Village team.

FAQ's

Q. What is the minimum age requirement?

Global Village volunteers must have turned 15 before the first day on the build site.

Q. Do GV School builds follow best practices for ethical and responsible student volunteering overseas?

Absolutely! Ask for a copy of our assessment for details.

Q. Can parents come too?

Yes, and it can be an amazing experience to share. Each school has different policies on this though, and students may prefer to go it alone, so talk with them first.

Q. Where will we stay?

Where you stay will vary depending on your destination but all volunteers will stay together in a comfortable hotel, with single, twin or triple-share rooms. The Habitat team will provide daily travel to the build site.
